Clean and contemporary

Clean lines, masculine styles and urban references characterise this trend. Italian brand Chimento Uomo combines steel, titanium, carbon and gold in its collection aimed at a younger market, in chunky nuts and bolts masculine styles.

Feniom uses titanium to great effect in its collections, most notably in its collaboration with young British designer John Moore, while the Finesse brand's Hardware collection and Gaventa's Square Mile cufflinks go for masculine monochrome.

Alessandro Testi, the new Italian men's brand launched by Rebecca, is inspired by contemporary Italian styles: this is less rugged and has a sophisticated, sleek style that incorporates black diamonds with elements designed to spin and move with the wearer.
